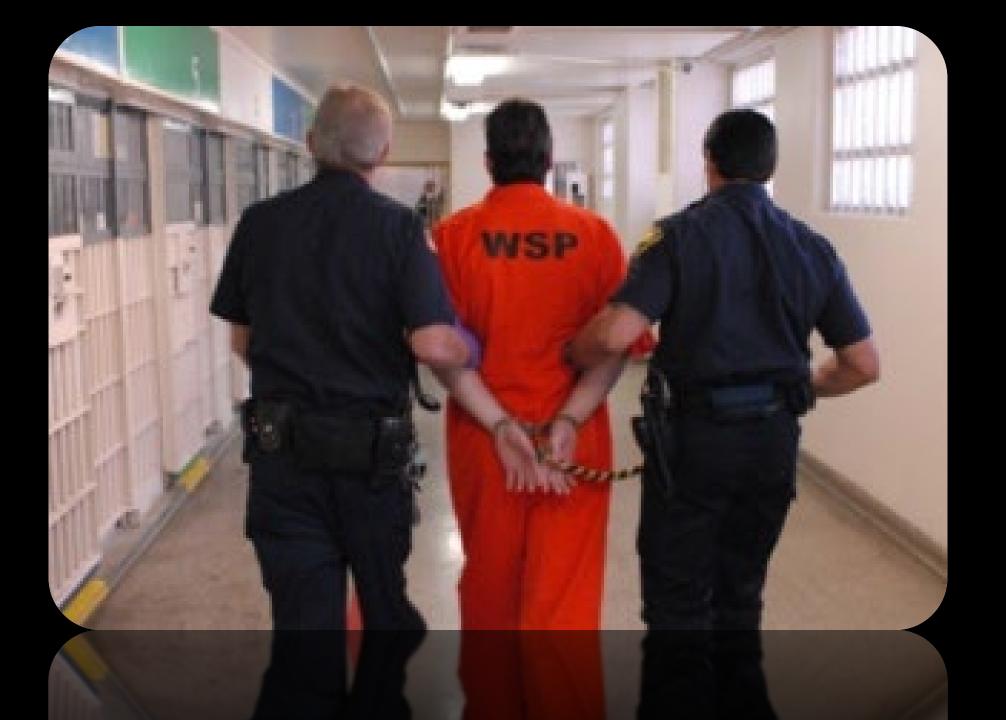

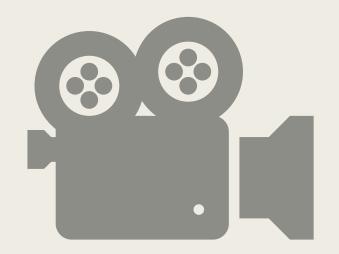

Statistics Risk Factors

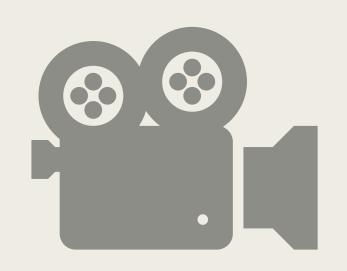
2001 to 2019, suicides increased 85% in state prisons, 61% in federal prisons, and 13% in local jails.

Suffocation accounted for nearly 90% of suicide deaths in local jails.

Approximately 12% of completed suicides in local jails occurred within the first 24 hours of incarceration.

Nearly 19% of corrections staff meet criteria for PTSD

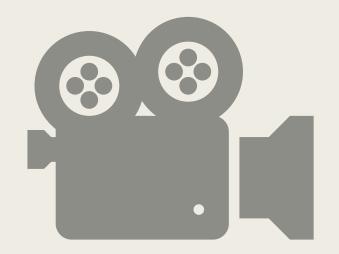
Suicide & Patient Loss

- Assumptions about competence
- A desire to leave the field
- PTSD
- Difficulty processing loss
- Stigma surrounding professional vulnerability

- Due to confidentiality, difficulty processing with peers to aid in validation
- Personal and professional isolation
- Potential negative and/or unsupportive reactions from colleagues

Staff Impact

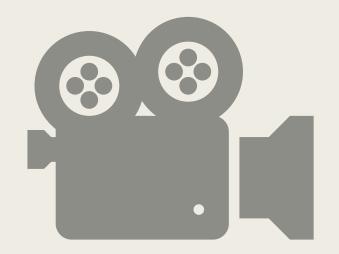
- Emotional and psychological toll
- Facility strain & increased workload
- Workplace safety and facility stability
- Compassion fatigue



PREVENTION & POSTVENTION

Prevention Through Preparedness

- Training for all staff
- Establishing clear protocols for communication and intervention
- Building relationships within staff and inmates
- Create a culture of awareness



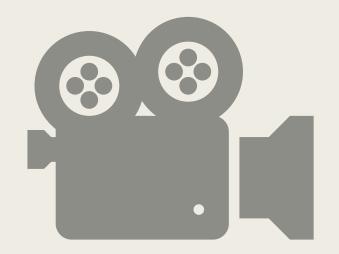
Longterm Support Systemic Change

Required Employee Assistance Programs (EAPs) and trauma-informed counseling.

Regular check-ins by leadership to monitor staff wellbeing.

Adjusting workloads to prevent repeated exposure to traumatic events.

Policy changes that prioritize staff mental health alongside inmate care.

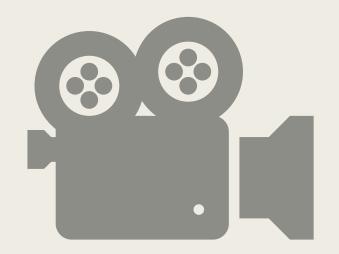
